

Work Experience and TY Programmes

- This is an opportunity to sample different jobs.
- Work experience helps students to decide what careers or college courses they wish to pursue after school.
- There are two separate Work experience weeks scheduled per year and we alco accommodate separate individual work placements

Assessment



- ► The school will use a variety of forms of assessment in looking at the students' personal and academic progress throughout the year.
- Continuous assessment means that they have to work hard all year round.
- ► They may also experience written, oral, aural, portfolio or folders, project displays, exhibitions of work, T.Y. Journal and Christmas Exams



- Reflecting the learning-led emphasis of the Transition Year programme, certification is school-based rather than national.
- ► The students will graduate at the end of the year with in-house certification and individual awards.








Application Process

Transition Year is one of the three Senior Cycle Programmes offered.

Students' ability is **not** an issue but their willingness to participate, their co-operation and work ethic is important.

Students applying for the course may be interviewed to assess their suitability.

Students' record of attendance, participation, attitude and behaviour in their 3rd Year are taken into account.
