Can a student go to further education and training?

Yes. The Leaving Certificate Applied is accepted for a wide range of Post Leaving Certificate (PLC) courses at FETAC Level 5. It also provides access to most apprenticeships and other vocational training awards.

Can a student go to Higher Education?

Graduates of Leaving Certificate Applied **do not** have direct access to Higher Education through the Central Applications Office (CAO).

However, achieving an appropriate further education award e.g. FETAC Level 5 may provide access for those who wish to apply to courses in Third Level colleges.

Who should consider Leaving Certificate Applied?

- Someone who wants to stay in school and get a Leaving Certificate
- ▶ Someone who prefers learning by doing
- Someone who would be motivated by continuous assessment
- Someone who wants to get work experience to help them with their career choice
- Someone who wants to develop skills which help them in their future career

It is a completely different programme to LCE.

Difference is the assessment-LCA is based on continuous assessment over 2 years.

- It is designed to cater for students who like to learn more practically.
- It is <u>applied</u> as opposed to theoretical so LCA allows students to apply their learning and experiences to practical educational tasks at school, in the workplace.

- 1. Prepares learners for the demanding transition to adult and working life.
- Recognises talents of all learners programme responsive to aptitudes, abilities, needs and interests.
- 3. Provides opportunity to develop in terms of responsibility, self-esteem and self-knowledge.
- 4. Develops communication and decision making skills.
- 5. Helps learners achieve a more independent and enterprising approach to learning and to life.

The LCA ...

What do they learn?

The curriculum is set but we tried to personalize it to meet the needs of each group

There are 3 sections to the LCA course

1. Vocational preparation

2. Vocational education (specialisms)

3.General education

The 1st area is Vocational Preparation



English & Communication this looks at preparing for work (CV, letters etc); language skills for business; media; novel; play; short story; film.



• Vocational Preparation & Guidance this subject covers Jobsearch; Enterprise; Community work; Careers Education



Work Experience – normally this is two weeks in 5th year and two weeks in 6th year







 Students do four work experience placements over the two years. Students get to do work experience in a range of different places, primary schools they went to, creches, hairdressers, offices, garages, painter and decorator. It gives students the opportunity to get a taste of what it is like in the work place.

The 2nd area is Vocational education

Mathematical Applications Budgeting; Invoices; Household bills; VAT; Payslips; Measurements

Information & Communication Computer skills

– word processing, spreadsheets, databases;

Graphics; New technologies- All of our LCA
students have IPADS to use in class

And includes two specialisms and this year we are doing


The 3rd area is General Education

- Languages
 - Gaeilge Conversation skills; Culture; History of the language; Arts
 - French Conversation skills; Useful French (travel arrangements, directions, food); Greetings; Culture and the arts
- Leisure and Recreation PE Active Leisure Studies Outdoor education (hill walking, camping, orienteering, climbing), fitness plans; coaching (swimming, football); health & safety in sport
- **Social Education** Understanding your community; Contemporary issues (Task); Taking Charge (banking, insurance, renting etc)

Assessment is continuous over 2 years Total 200 credits (100%)

LCA Certification

Certification awarded at 3 levels

PASS	120 - 139 credits	60-69%
MERIT	140 - 169 credits	70-84%
DISTINCTION	170 - 200 credits	85-100%


Students who acquire less than 120 credits or who leave the programme early will receive a "Record of Experience".

The LCA can lead to further progression in education


'Who would benefit most from the Leaving Certificate Applied?
